



LEGISLATION UPDATES

- Technical amendments to the <u>Payment Times Reporting Act 2020</u> (the Act) were passed by Parliament on 10 February 2022.
- These amendments are operational in nature and address regulator delegations, provide clarity and consistency for reporting requirements, and remedy reporting restrictions for entities volunteering to report.
- The changes allow volunteering entities to commence reporting in the first reporting period after giving notice to volunteer, including in the middle of an income year.
- Previously, volunteering entities were required to wait until the beginning of the next income year before commencing to report.

STATUTORY REVIEW

- The Payment Times Reporting Act requires a statutory review be completed in the first half of 2023.
 - > Exact timing is a matter for the Minister to decide
- This review will assess the efficacy of the PTRS, as well as the alternative measures that are available.
- The Review will provide for public consultation and all interested parties are encouraged to participate.
- The independent reviewer will submit a written report of findings and recommendations to the Government.

- Our approach to non-compliance is set out in <u>Information sheet 1: Our approach to regulation</u>.


